An old tight hairline that was glued years ago and isn't going anywhere (probably from fitting the dowel stick). Original tuners and metal parts including tailpiece. Nicely fitted skin head. We're calling the case the original hardshell but we're not sure Vega was using these "bump" cases that early, the case may be later than the banjo.

Vega (used, 1922) Whyte Laydie Style R tenor banjo ... This banjo, which bears the illustrious Whyte Laydie tone ring, has a generous head diameter of 11 7/8". This is the perfect head size for conversion to a Round Peak old time clawhammer banjo, and this is easily obtained by simply adding a 5-string replica neck. The Whyte Laydie model was introduced in 1901 and then something really bad happened - in March of 1904 the Fairbanks factory had a ferocious fire (factually, a fearsome conflagration). Luckily, the Vega Banjo Company was located in the same town and took over production.

Long-neck banjos were fairly popular during that period, after their invention by the late Pete Seeger; it dramatically increases the versatility of the instrument.
